UPDATE

Stairs and walkway still too dangerous to use

Happy New Year everyone! There is not much more to report as far as the beach is concerned. We have filed our FEMA application and we are awaiting acceptance of our request.

In the meantime, the wooden structure at the beach has deteriorated further. The stairs are not attached to the structure. The support pilings have no sand under them and are not stable - the middle bowed and cracked. IT IS NOT SAFE TO WALK ON. PLEASE STAY OFF OF IT. We have signs posted on the structure indicating that it's DANGEROUS. We have a structural engineer scheduled for the week of January 23, 2023. Her damage report will be submitted to FEMA.

Fences were installed on the entry way to the walkway from both the beach side and the ICW side. Anyone trespassing will be prosecuted. It is simply not safe for anyone to be on the walkway.

Special thank you's to Captain Eric, Trustee Joe Lewis, community members Susan and Bill Juranek and Trustee Julie Packard for assisting with this project.

We are doing all we can to secure the walkway, and to get the structure rebuilt so that we all can use the beach we love. Some kayakers have told me that there is a spot near the small island to the right of the ferry that you are able to cross to the beach side. Please use that area and stay AWAY from the ferry landing area.

There is no estimate of the time it will take with FEMA, debris removal, or the rebuild. After we meet with the structural engineer we'll know more. Conservatively, we are looking at 6-9 months. Your patience and understanding is appreciated.

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

State of the Market
