

### **LETTER TO THE EDITOR:**

I wrote a letter to the 'Wave' about six months ago asking why there was not any 'news' articles regarding our neighborhood and board activities including financial reports, resignations, and local crime. No one responded, including board members. I have seen no letters since. Each month there are congratulatory messages to volunteers and mentions of assaults, vandalism, and the like [all at the ferry/boat launch area]. No details are provided and these 'issues' are not supported in reports from the Sarasota Sherriff's Department.

This Summer there was much significant news, such as the letter from Sarasota County to both of our Boards which has now resulted in a law suit against us, the forfeiture of a Public grant to the Beach Trust, the resignation of several Board members and their replacements, none of which was reported in the latest 'Wave'. Despite a dance/party on the 4th of July, pancake breakfasts, and rental of our community center no financial or attendance information was reported. Why are our Boards so secretive? What are they hiding? I figure that membership in the Civic Association amounts to approximately less than 3% of the potential, why is that? It is not the expense.

Why do our Boards select their own members? Can they not stand criticism? To be elected one must first be 'vetted' by the Board and those that pass are put to a vote only by those members who attend the June meeting, which is far less than 1/100th of our potential members. Does the Association need to pass into obscurity? The silence is deafening.

#### **SVCA President Doogue responds:**

The SVCA is not involved in any way with the suit from Sarasota County, the suit is against the SVBET, and I suggest he contact a Trustee for further information

Financial reports will be available at the end of the year, and will be available at the SVCA office.

I suggest the gentleman attend our monthly meetings at which he will be educated on a number of the points he raises. We also always have a very interesting speaker as part of our educated consumer program.

At every public meeting, Deputy Duff reports on the crime situation in South Venice.

As a private organization, the Board of Directors appoints a nominating committee, which solicits candidates, and the candidates are then vetted by the Board prior to being proposed for membership on the Board. Board members then vote on the inclusion of those nominees on the potential board member list, and appoints a new board member. The public at the general meeting ratifies the Board.

All organizations today, struggle to gain members, and we would welcome any suggestions Mr. Hudson has for increasing membership. He can of course volunteer to be on the membership committee, where his ideas would be most welcome, to help us attract new members.

I believe Mr. Hutson has talked to a number of members on the SVCA Board and has been given a lot of answers to his questions. I suggest he come to our meetings and also read the Wave and in so doing will find out what the SVCA does for the community.

Happy New Year and Welcome to 2022! 2021 was certainly an interesting and record-breaking year for real estate. At the time of this article (12/18/21) the Year-To-Date sales for South Venice Beach are 460! I would not be surprised if the number reaches over 500 by December 31; I will update the year end numbers in mid-January when I write the February Market Update! Also, perhaps more interesting is that the average closed price per home is \$301,865—compared to last year, which was \$232,656. Bottom line is we have seen significant appreciation in this area!
