UPDATE

Hurricane Recovery at Beach and Ferry properties

From CHERYL COOPER, Beach Trust Chair

Greetings from the SVBET. I hope everyone had a great Christmas and wish everyone a prosperous New Year!

Please allow this note to serve as a short update on Hurricane Ian damage, beach activities and the facilities of 4800 Lemon Bay Drive.

We have been working diligently to repair the damaged areas at the ferry field property and to restore the water service which was blown up by Hurricane Ian. You may have noticed the new shed that has been installed near the boat ramp. The old shed, there to protect the well head, was destroyed in Ian.

A special thank you is owed to Trustee Julie Packard for doing all the research on what we were permitted to install and locating a shed for us. A very special thank you also to Trustee Chuck Bauman and Trustee Joe Lewis along with community members Clyde Johnson and Richie Stover, who all worked in the very hot sun all day to get this shed assembled. It looks great! You may have also noticed the widened gates which should provide better access for the boats at the ramp.

We have now purchased and had installed a whole new water system for the ferry house, as Ian destroyed the old one. So, that is completed. The ferry itself is ready to use and the Captains are ready to work. However, the walkway over the dune and the stairs are NOT safe. PLEASE STAY Discussed 2023 Election Cycle and candidates for slate OFF OF THEM!! We had the original marine engineer over to the beach to inspect these stairs and offer suggestions. The Trustees are all concerned for safety, but we also want to get this open as soon as possible. The project is huge and will be VERY expensive. We are awaiting an estimate.

> The trust has retained the services of an agency to assist our community in obtaining a FEMA grant for some or all of the project. This is a process of many steps. We need

Really Cool Gadget

Do you know how cool your hearing aids are? I mean really, really cool.

This is the coolest gadget you can wear. It not only helps you listen to the people in your life, it also listens for you. It hears the hum of the AC in your car and softens this noise. It listens for the wind and takes that noise away. It listens for voices and amplifies them, so you hear the people around you.

The new "smart" hearing aids determine sound quality in the room you are in and provide automatic adjustments. If you are in a small room and adjust the volume for louder sound, your hearing aid will remember this. After a few times of this same action on your part, your hearing aid will automatically provide sounds at the louder volume in these settings.

Imagine you drive to our office to see Blair. While you are in your car, your hearing aid is using a program to soften mechanical sounds and amplify voices. As you step out of your car and the wind tousles your shirt, your hearing aid switches to a program that removes noise caused by wind. Then when you entered our office and the doorbell dings, your hearing aids change to its primary program and began looking for voices to amplify.

When you walk down the hallway and step into Blair's office, your hearing aid switches again to decrease any echo sounds that occur in smaller areas. As I mentioned in the beginning of this article, if you repeatedly upped the volume in smaller areas, your hearing aid will automatically increase the volume to your preference.

Overtime, this hearing aid learns what you prefer in different settings and will help you hear without having to fiddle with buttons.

This little device that hangs on your ear all day listens intent-

ly, to give you the sounds you want and squash the sounds you don't want, so you hear clearly in conversations.

everyone's patience, and - when the time is right - cooperation and assistance in getting our beach and ferry back up and running.

In the meantime, the trust office will be selling the new boat ramp passes for 2023. The cost remains the same as last year at \$120.

This year, there will be fences going up near the kayak launch area and kayakers will be charged for access to that area. The cost will be \$100 per kayak which is less than our neighbor, South Venice Yacht Club. Those passes and stickers will be available at the Trust office.

Finally, we have experienced more vandalism at the ferry house, even with the locks and cameras. It is a shame that this exists in our community. The Trust is now investigating the retention of a security company and/or management company. We recognize that most of our neighbors respect the property and amenities and for that, we thank you. There are a few that ruin things for the majority. If you see something going on or being damaged, please call 911. Do NOT attempt to handle things on your own.

Finally, thank you to everyone for your patience and understanding during this challenging time.
