Board Governance: The cycle for elections for the 2022-2023 SVCA Board of Directors will begin in March. Below is the timeline and procedures as described in our current policy and procedures:

MARCH - per the Articles of Incorporation, Board conappoints a Nomination Committee, which invites nominations from interested SVCA members. Com- As always, new members are welcome. Just show up and mittee develops a slate of nominees.

APRIL - the full Board votes to accept the proposed slate of nominees.

MAY - the proposed slate is published in the May issue of the Wave. Petitions to be added to the slate will be accepted up to ten days after publication.

JUNE - revised slate is published in the June WAVE. At the Annual Meeting of the Membership, the revised slate is presented with either a yes/no vote if the number of candidates match the available seats or, if not, a vote is held with the candidates with greatest number of votes then elected.

Speakers at our February meeting were from Simply Trees, and they discussed palm trees with our members. Many of

us were surprised to learn that palms are related to the family of grasses and bamboos!

We were warned about Ganoderma, a lethal mushroom that causes root rot in palms, causing them to become unstable and fall. If that happens, the palm should be removed. Surrounding ground is also infected with spores for at least five feet, so don't ever plant any palm nor its relatives there again.

What does the clock have to do with pruning?! Proper palm pruning is achieved by removing the fronds that hang below a 9:00am -3:00pm position. Anything more (like the all too popular "Hurricane haircut") can weaken the palm, leaving it open to disease and more vulnerable in hurricanes.

Dead wood, rubbing and crossing limbs can be removed to improve the plant's health. If limbs are hanging over your roof, consider just cutting back that section rather than removing the entire limb.

I tend to be a heavy-handed pruner but our guest arborists Amber and Joe advised removing only 25% or less in a pruning cycle (with how quickly things grow here, patience is in order [for me]!).

One piece of advice on oak trees: It is common to see Spanish moss, bromeliads and staghorn ferns in the crotches (where the trunk splits into two large branches) of oaks. This traps moisture leading to decay and disease. It was a great program. You can contact these charming professionals at their business, Simply Trees, at 941-479-2726.

March 5 will be our annual Plant and Rummage Sale. We'll have experienced gardeners on hand to advise attendees about the plants for sale. And there's rummage too, including clothing, household items, books and some furniture. Join us and let's keep beautifying South Venice with Florida-friendly, native plants.

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



State of the Market

KELLEY ANN AYERS, Ayers Team, Exit King Realty

This FIFTH generation Florida gal is happy it warmed up! There were a few days it was hard to go outside and I did not realize you are supposed to wear layers...in the house! LOL. I would like to mention the traffic this year seems to be heavier than the Februarys in years past! I am normally very confident driving our roads, but this year I feel like a cat with all the movement and the darting electric bicycles frightening me a couple of times! Be careful out there and stay safe!

Now, down to business! Thirty-seven homes sold in the last thirty-day period; the highest was for \$895,000 on Lemon Bay Drive across from the ferry with Gulf Views and remodeled. The lowest sale was \$210,000 and the average "sold price per square foot" this period was up - at \$265.69! The average sale price this period was \$358,051 and the Average Days On Market was just ten days!
