We had internet installed at the ferry house and at the shed near the boat ramp. We upgraded to 4k video surveillance cameras at the

boat ramp that are viewable real time and well as recording to the cloud.

This has already proved invaluable in identifying violators of the rules. In addition, the security cameras at the ferry house were also upgraded to 4k. A big thank you to Chuck and Joe Lewis for the install of the cameras near the boat ramp. Thank you to Randall and his trusty helpers who installed the cameras at the ferry house.

ers. Those people are not eligible for passes for the ferry or boat ramp and will no longer have access to the property. We are prosecuting all rule and law violators.

Chuck Bauman and Joe Lewis also removed and reinstalled the old bulletin board inside of the ferry house. Chuck replaced the rotting wood and Nancy Bauman repainted the entire thing. Be sure to check out the bright colors and beautiful artwork. It certainly makes the inside of the ferry house look bright and new!

We have ordered swing gates for the boat ramp to replace the heavy hook and chain. Thank you to our South Venice resident artist, Jennifer Vass for designing the artwork that will be on the gates that are coming.

For the coming year, 2022 on the boat ramp, the ferry as well as entrance to the property at 4800 Lemon Bay Drive all entrances onto the ferry and boat ramp will be done via electronic locks that are linked to your smartphone. There will not be a manual key or "dolphin" pass. These locks will allow us to track the user, time and date used and also to time lock the property where it will NOT be accessible. SVCA Document Clean-up underway

Captain's Corner



We captains get a lot of questions about the wildlife we see on and in the water around the ferry. Most questions center around two aquatic mammal species: dolphins and manatees. We do see dolphins and manatees frequently. In fact, almost daily. Dolphins stick around all year, while manatees are seasonal. As the water gets

cooler, the manatees move south to the Keys, or north to the springs and power plants. Occasionally, someone asks about alligators (obviously not a mammal), which I've written about previously.

But we seldom get questions about the other frequent water mammal in the bay: otters.

Florida is a native home to the North American River around here. We don't see them enough to know we have a resident population in Alligator Creek, where

they live in burrows along the bank. They come into the bay to hunt fish, their main source of food.

I started at the ferry. I was pulling the old boat (you all We hope you notice and approve of the improvements and remember that junker) into the ferry house when I startled a family of them to crawl under the sea wall and up the rock covered bank on the north side of the building. It took a second to realize what I was seeing. It was probably a mother and pups since there was a significant difference in size. What surprised me was the size of the adult. It was at least three feet long, and for an instant I thought it was a medium size dog. Prior to that, the only river otters I had seen were in the Florida Aquarium in Tampa, although I used to see plenty of sea otters (Enhydra lutris) when I lived and sailed in Alaska.

> When the otters show up, typically along the mangrove prop roots, it's usually a good show. The juveniles are very

playful, wrestling and chasing each other. When they feed, you can see them swimming swiftly under the surface, and then popping up to eat small fish. If they catch a big fish, they come up on the bank to feast, but I've never witnessed that.

Some Interesting Otter Facts: They have clear eyelids, allowing them to see under water. They can stay submerged for as long as eight minutes. They can run nearly 20 miles per hour on land. And they can kill alligators. Despite their cuteness, steer clear. They have been known to attack humans when confronted. They are most active at night, so run-ins are rare, but they have been known to be aggressive toward kayakers who venture too close.

Otters were hunted to near extinction in some areas by French fur traders in the 18th Century, and while they are not threatened in Florida, they are elusive.



State of the Market

Welcome Back to our seasonal residents! Thirty eight home sales were in the last thirty day period! The highest sale this time was for \$715,000 on Lemon Bay Drive, built in 2006 and located across from the Beach Ferry Park. There was only one home that sold for under \$200,000, which we have not seen in a while! The average sale price this period was \$325,647, also up from last period. Average Days On Market was remarkably just 13 days! Currently there are 58 Homes Pending, ranging in asking prices from \$700,000 to \$200,000 and the inventory remains very low!
