How do you know if you have a hearing loss? The easy answer is you won't.

You won't notice at all. It is your family and friends who will notice your loss. They are the ones who have to repeat everything for you. They are the ones who repeat what the waitress said. They are the ones who repeat what the punchline of the joke is. They are the ones who repeat what your young grandchild asks. They are the ones who repeat what the news anchor announced as breaking news. They are the ones who repeat when the next meeting will be held.

We had a woman who heard me speak at her community event. She had asked the question, how do I know I have a loss? I told her only a hearing test would define any loss she had.

Karen heard her share that she was coming in as a favor to her son-in-law who was frustrated enough to say, I love you and I want you to hear what I say, please get your hearing tested.

As Karen remarked, that is a great man, to know that hearing what he says is how to show him love.

The sentence that saddened Karen was when the woman said, I don't think my loss is that bad. My husband and I hear the same things, so it isn't that bad of a loss. Karen didn't point out that hearing the same could mean both of them have a significant hearing loss. That neither are hearing what others are trying to share with them.

How do you know if you have a hearing loss? You have family and friends who repeat things for you. They love you enough to repeat things.

If you don't hear your friends and family the first time they share something and want a hearing test to know if you have a loss call 941-244-9300 for a free test.

# **Beach Trust News**

Hello after a long summer. We hope everyone is back and settling in for the holiday season. A few announcements from the Trust.

First, Trustee Joe Lewis has taken over as chair of the SVBET. Joe is retired from a long career in the insurance



business. He's been a huge asset to the Trust assisting for the past three years with the coastguard inspections, beach repair after Ian, repairs of all kinds, and coordinating the captains. He has been involved in so many aspects of managing the Trust, this is the next logical step.

We will begin selling the ferry passes on December 16, 2023. The passes are annual only and run from January 1, 2024

to December 31, 2024. There is no prorating. (If you buy a pass in the middle of the year, it still ends December 31, 2024. Similar to last year, A limited number of non-resident passes will be sold on a first come, first served basis. The number of non resident passes are limited to 50 annually.

The beach suffered heavy damage during Ian and even recently. Despite applying, and using the services of a con-

sulting company, we received no federal aid for repairs. The ferry also suffered damages and had to undergo repairs at a large expense in October last year. We are forced to raise the prices. The annual fees are as follows:

Resident ferry	\$180.00
Resident boat ramp	\$150.00
Non resident ferry	\$360.00
Non resident boat ramp	\$300.00

Damages to the beach and walkway were extensive, cost a lot to repair, and it continues.

The passes you bought last year are renewable. You do not need to get new photos or a new ID. The entrance system is functioning and after the first of the year if your ferry pass does not swipe green, you will not be able to use the ferry. The regulation of the passes is electronic. There will only be a 10-day grace period in which to renew you passes, but after January 10, 2024, if your pass does not swipe green you will not gain access to the ferry until you clear the issue with the office. Lifetime members need not contact the office.

We will be doing some events this year to try to raise some extra funds in order to keep the prices from going up. We hope you will support the SVBET and the ferry by attending. The first event is on December 16 - we will be selling hot dogs, hamburgers, sodas and water at the ferry. We need to raise money to purchase yet another motor for the *Continued on Page 9*

Jim Drummond took on the task of removing and replacing the back kitchen door. The door had warped badly and could not even be locked without pushing or pulling it while trying to turn the knob. Jim spent a good deal of time leveling and adjusting the new door. The cement/ small backyard garden, plant a seed, create new life, then block opening was far from square. The SVCA building was built in 1955. There are always Seeds, soil, plants, fertilizer, containers, space – Wolinsky things that need to be repaired or replaced. For instance, we need to replace soffits that were blown off by hurricane lan, one of our kitchen burners does not work, the men's room bathroom floor needs to be replaced or repaired, etc. If you can volunteer to assist in any of these repairs it will be greatly appreciated.

ferry. (This was done in 2020, but the engine is not holding up like they used to).


